Research Paper Competition

Papers can be submitted in one of the following categories (professional/research, graduate student, or undergraduate student). All papers submitted to the conference will be considered for awarding of the "Best Paper Award" in their appropriate category, issued at the discretion of the Conference Program Committee. The prestigious Katherine Snow Award and a monetary stipend will be awarded to the best paper in the faculty category.

Session Proposals

Proposals for special sessions, panel sessions, tutorials, etc. should be submitted in writing to the conference and program chairs. These proposals should highlight the topic

to be presented as well as the target audience. For conference panels, tutorials, or demonstrations, please prepare a brief, two page proposal and forward to the conference and program chairs listed below.

Ongoing Research Track

A top priority of the ITERA conference is to provide faculty a flexible, yet high payoff venue for presenting their research. While we welcome the presentation of work at any stage of research, it is ITERA's strong sense that we can also serve our members by encouraging the presentation of new research approaches, proposed research, and ongoing research in its early stages.

In those cases where material is submitted to the conference and it is the desire of the authors that the work be published by ITERA, the authors can be confident in claiming that the work has undergone a full peer review. Such work, upon later completion, can be submitted for consideration at ITERA or other conferences or publications.

The Information and Telecommunications Education & Research Association (ITERA) is a nonprofit academic organization committed to the advancement of telecommunications science through excellence in research and education. Telecommunication science draws from multiple disciplines, including communication and information technology management, and policy. The ITERA conferences began in 2002 as the Murray State University Telecommunications & Information Technology Conferences (TSM 2002-2004).
